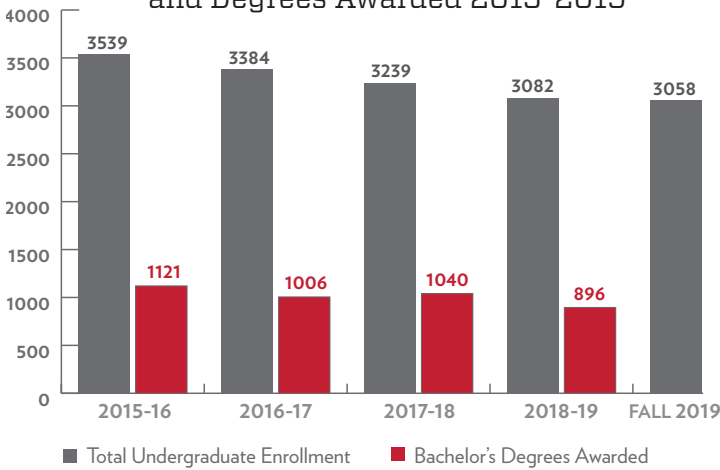

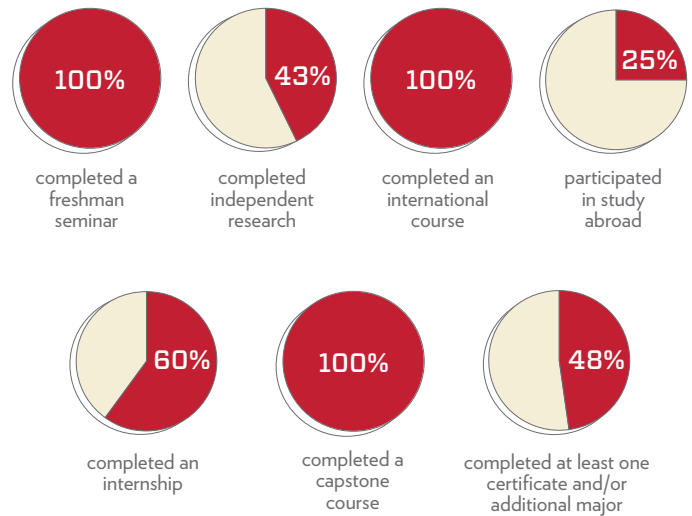

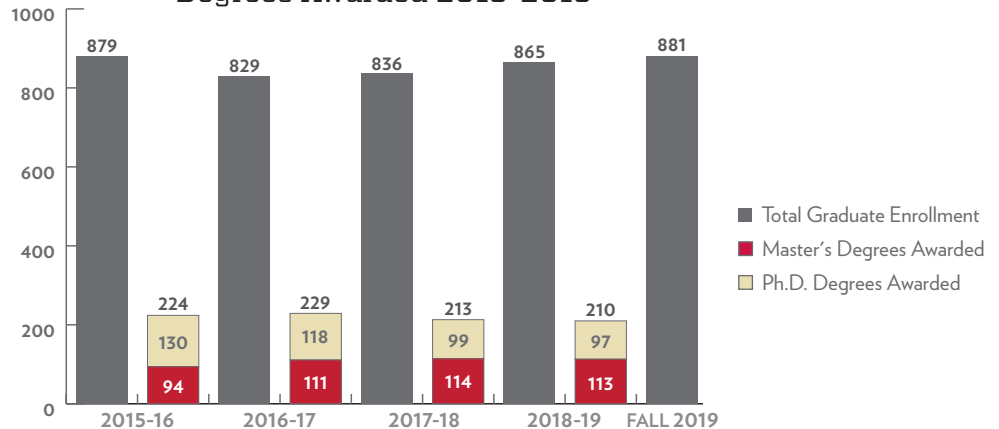

CALS Graduate Enrollment and Degrees Awarded 2015-2019

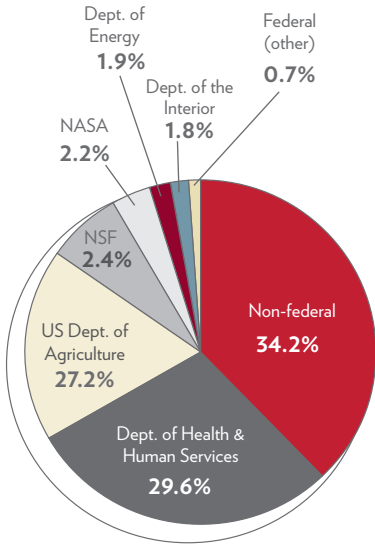
