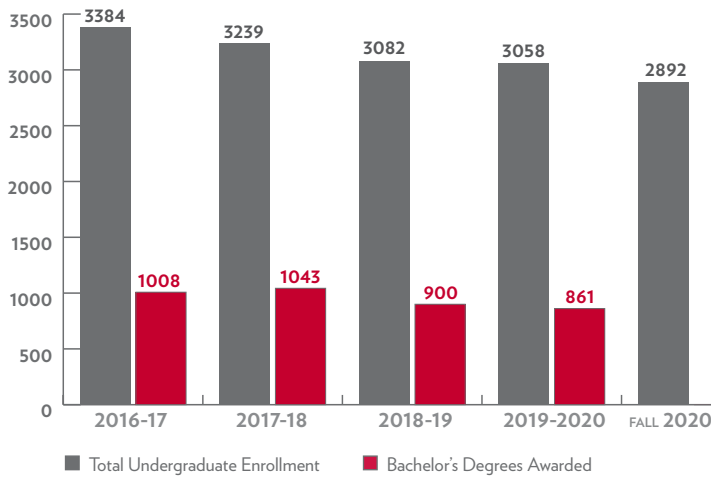

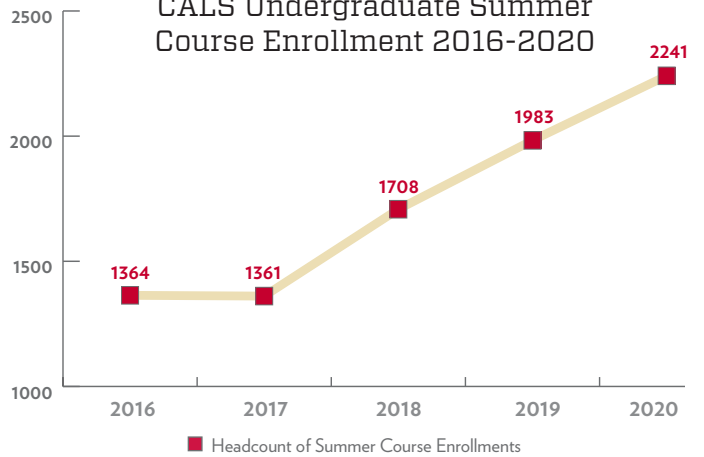

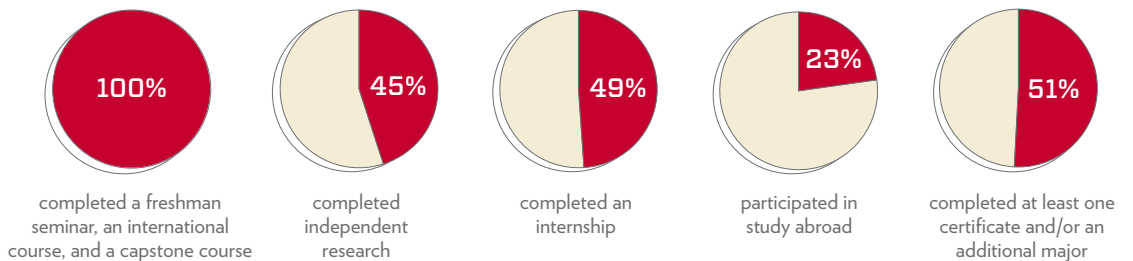


CALS Undergraduate Summer Course Enrollment 2016-2020

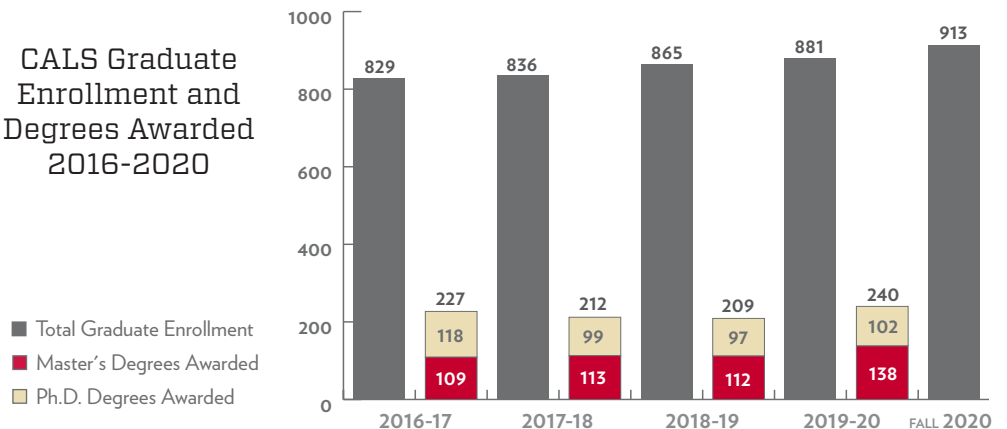

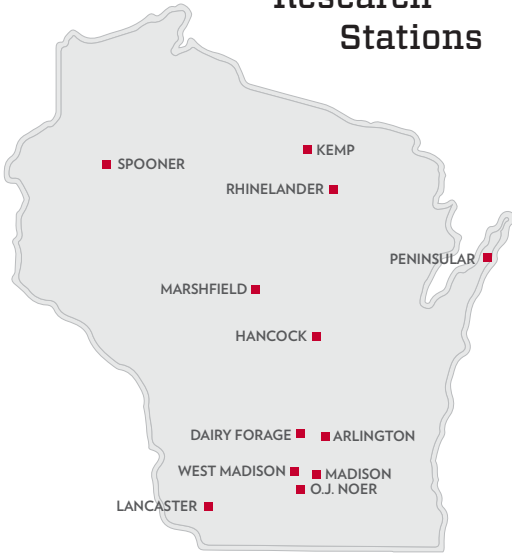
CALS Graduate Enrollment and Degrees Awarded 2016-2020

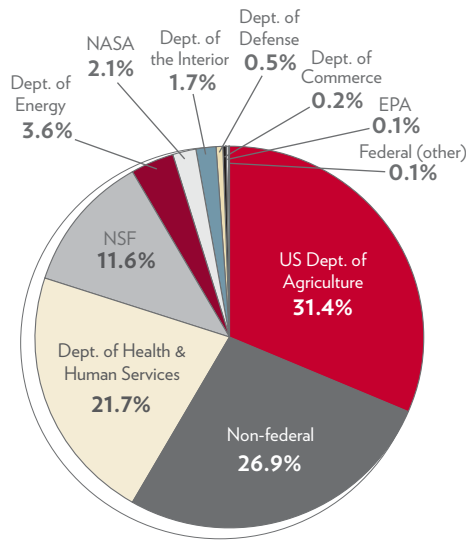

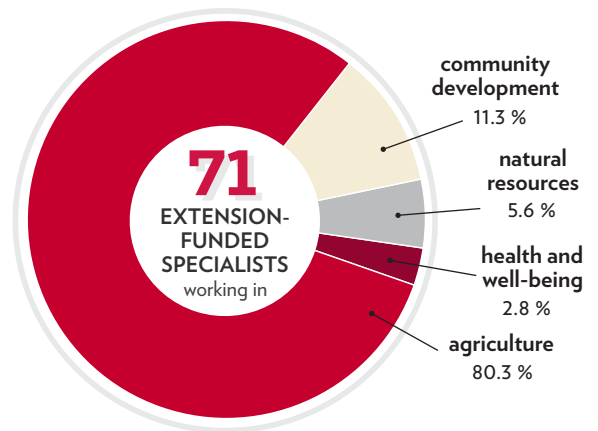
EXTENSION & OUTREACH

Faculty and staff in CALS support Wisconsin's \$104.8 billion agricultural, horticultural, food and bioenergy sectors through research-based extension and outreach programs that promote farm profitability, rural economic development, environmental sustainability and vibrant and healthy communities. The UW-Madison Division of Extension funds 71 faculty and staff in CALS to work with county-based Extension educators to develop and deliver Extension programs across the state. A similar number of CALS faculty and staff engage in outreach activity that translates the results of their research into educational activities for a variety of stakeholder groups in Wisconsin, the nation and the world.
